Board Members have the opportunity to report and discuss information regarding conference attendance, committee updates, and other District-related activities/observations.

- Mr. Renteria thanked Ms. Keenoy, her staff and Rivera Elementary students for hosting the Board meeting. He commented about his attendance at the Southern California 2012 School Construction Summit and how enlightening and insightful it was for us in our planning of where we need to be with our schools. He recently made visitations to El Rancho High School and Durfee Elementary School.
- Mrs. Canchola thanked Mr. Salcido for bringing to the forefront the issue of how we can get more funding, more money for our schools. She highlighted the El Rancho High School Teen Court program which will be a model program for the State as well as their Entrepreneurial class which has started dialogue with the Chamber of Commerce on how students can support the community. She also thanked Ms. Celiz for her great planning with the Baseball Hall of Fame. She as well, attended the California Construction Summit.
- Mrs. Alvidrez also thanked Ms. Keenoy and her staff for hosting the meeting. She expressed her excitement about Salazar High School being named a Model Continuation High School. The staff and principal all worked together to make this the program that it is. Mrs. Alvidrez also shared information on the SASSFA Mini Job Fair at the Adult School on February 7-16 where there will be many employers present that need to fill various job vacancies.
- Mrs. Ramirez reiterated Mrs. Canchola's comments about the Baseball Hall of Fame. They were able to raise enough funds to arrange for the purchase of a scoreboard. She shared her appreciation to Ms. Keenoy for the wonderful presentation. Mrs. Ramirez had the privilege of visiting Mr. Reyes at Salazar High and enjoys seeing the great things that are happening there. She would like to see them recognized by the Board in the future. She as well thanked Dr. Cote' for having the School News posted online. It is another way to let the community know of all the good things that are happening in our schools.

He recognized Mr. Ortiz for the outstanding job he did with the event. Senator Calderon pledged a \$1,000 scholarship for a deserving El Rancho High School student. He thanked Rose Hills for providing a \$2,500 scholarship as well. He was very impressed with the Baseball Hall of Fame event. He extended his appreciation to David Narvaez and CSEA for the Installation Breakfast invitation.

## 12. SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

- Dr. Cote' invited Principal Sam Genis to share information about El Rancho High School's Academic Decathlon team. They placed 7<sup>th</sup> overall in Los Angeles County out of 50 schools and received 21 medals. They now qualify to go on to the State level from March 15 18. Mr. Genis also shared that El Rancho High will be holding their first annual Open House on February 16. Everyone is invited to attend.
- Dr. Cote' joined the Board in congratulating Salazar High School on receiving the Model Continuation High School award. The California Construction event was excellent. In the process of visiting schools. Have had the opportunity to visit Birney and Rivera Middle School.

- A. Approved/Ratified the Amendment to Contract with Alma Family Services to increase from \$73,000 by an amount not to exceed \$30,000 for the period to include July 1, 2011 to June 30, 2012. The adjusted total amount of the Contract shall not exceed \$103,000 payable from the Safe Schools/Healthy Students Grant.
- B. Approved/Ratified the Amendment to Contract with Penny Lane Centers to decrease payment of Contract from \$73,000 by an amount not to exceed \$30,000 for the period to include July 1, 2011 to June 30, 2012. The adjusted total amount of the Contract shall not exceed \$43,000. Payment shall be made in accordance with Section 1 C of the Contract dated June 23, 2011. Approved/Ratified Master Contract and individual pupil service tuition agreement for the 2011/2012 school year through the Whittier Area Cooperative Special Education Program negotiated between El Rancho Unified School District and Del Sol School, a state Certified Non-Public agency, for identified and Board-approved El Rancho students to attend this agency in accordance with Public Law 108-446 IDEA; Education Code Sections 56035, 56365-56366 and 56740. Total expenditure of \$25,690.00 is payable through the Federal & State Special Education Block Grants.
- D. Approved/Ratified Addendum to the Individual Service Agreement previously approved on June 23, 2011, item 9.2T through the Whittier Area Cooperative Special Education Program between El Rancho Unified School District and WAPADH-Whittier Area Parents Association for the Developmentally Handicapped. The purpose of this addendum is to delete 11 sessions of speech services and add 11 sessions of AT services for Student from July 1, 2011 through June 30, 2012 for a new total of \$3,300.00 payable through the Federal & State Special Education Block Grants.
- E. Approved/Ratified Addendum to the Individual Service Agreement previously approved on October 13, 2011, item 15.2I through the Whittier Area Cooperative Special Education Program between El Rancho Unified School District and Speech and Language Development Center. The purpose of this addendum is to add 10 hours/year of AAC Consult Services for Student from July 1, 2011 through June 30, 2012 for a new total of \$51,892.00 payable through the Federal & State Special Education Block Grants.
- F. Approved/Ratified Master Contract and individual pupil service tuition agreements for the 2011/2012 school year through the Whittier Area Cooperative Special Education Program negotiated between El Rancho Unified School District and Rossier Park Jr./Sr. High School, a state Certified Non-Public agency, for identified and Board-approved El Rancho students to attend this agency in accordance with Public Law 108-446 IDEA; Education Code Sections 56035, 56365-56366 and 56740. Total expenditure of \$97,009.80 is payable through the Federal & State Special Education Block Grants.
