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Local Control Accountability Plan (LCAP) Information

The passage of the Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF) legislation represents the most significant education finance reform in four decades. Under LCFF, the responsibility for determining the use of funds now resides with the school district's local governing board. Districts and charters must develop and locally approve a Local Control and Accountability Plan (LCAP) on or before July 1, 2014. Through the development of the LCAP, districts are expect to develop annual goals for the state priorities and for any local priorities identified.

El Rancho Unified has conducted numerous stakeholder meetings in the month of February as well as implemented a district community survey to help gather input for the development of the LCAP. A district LCAP committee comprised of representatives from across the district, including staff, parents, and students, are now collaborating to develop a draft of the LCAP to present to the Board by June 2014.
