#### **LCAP Committee Overview**

#### **Objective**

- Over the course four meetings, the Committee will develop a series of broadbased policy recommendations to increase student success at ERUSD.
- These recommendations will be presented to the Superintendent and the Board of Education as the proposed "guiding principles" for the Local Control Accountability Plan, a critical part of California's new educational funding system.
- With the Board serving as the official governing entity, the Committee will act as an advisory body to it.

#### **Tentative Tasks**

- + Establish a common understanding of the committee process and LCAP. Begin aligning district vision to LCAP.
- + Review the results of the district-wide LCAP survey and student achievement data.
- Generate ideas and priorities from the survey results. Formulate tentative policy recommendations based on data.
- Finalize policy recommendations with next action steps, and prepare for presentation to the Board.

# Section 2: Identifying goals linked to state priorities
