- Jose Lara questioned revenue to the District from the passage of Proposition 30 and the restoration of a full school year. He suggested offering a dual language immersion program to attract more students to the District.

- Alfred Renteria thanked the audience for attending. He visited the Education Center's Open House for the Adult Transition Program.
- Rita Jo Ramirez thanked Laura Castillo and Billie Saavedra for the Food Services presentation. She requested Food Services to follow up on a petition shared with the Board by El Rancho High students asking for more food choices. Mrs. Ramirez wished all the mothers a Happy Mother's Day. She stated that issuing the May 15 layoff notices to teachers is hard, that we are doing the best we can.
- Rachel Canchola toured the high school and a middle school with a representative from the State of California General Services Office of Public School Construction as a result of the recent newspaper article. The agency representative indicated that there is a reimbursement program available to school districts that have a facilities hardship.

- A. Approved agreement for vision screening services between *Dr. Wayne W. Hoeft, O.D.* and the El Rancho Unified School District for the 2013/2014 school year. Cost of services is \$3.50 per student, payable from the Health Services General fund budget account not to exceed \$12,000.00.
