- 12. <u>PUBLIC COMMENTS</u> ITEMS NOT ON THE AGENDA (Yellow speaker's card) Public Comments is the time when members of the audience may address the Board on matters <u>not listed on the agenda</u>. Please be aware that Government Code 54954.2 prohibits the Board from taking action at this meeting if the item does not already appear on the posted agenda. Please do not refer to students, employees, parents, or other individuals in a derogatory or potentially offensive manner.
 - Mr. Rico Tamayo, President of the El Rancho Federation of Teachers, addressed the Board about teachers receiving pink slips.
 - Ms. Monica Sorenson, El Rancho Unified teacher, spoke about budget cuts to education and implored the Board to look at where unnecessary spending can be cut.
 - Ms. Gila Lopez, community member, shared with the Board the impact Durfee Elementary special education teacher, Mr. Lopez, has on her autistic grandson.
 - Ms. Camille Barajas, parent, addressed the Board about obtaining a permit for her son to attend Santa Fe High School.
 - Ms. Kristine Glaze, Pico Rivera Alliance to Keep Youth Tobacco Free (Pico Rivera AKT), along with El Rancho High School students, Emily Payton and Lynette Haro, shared information about the effects tobacco smoke has on people. The Alliance is comprised of high school students, organizations and community members who are committed to protecting youth from tobacco use through education and community awareness. Dr. Rivera invited Ms. Glaze and Pico Rivera AKT to participate in the District sponsored Health Fair which will be held on May 12.
 - Mr. Louis Salcido, community member, offered kudos and congratulations to the District for getting information about the schools out to the public through the School News online publication. He feels we should be doing everything possible to get this news out to the community and requested the information on the adult transition program be included in future issues. Mr. Salcido shared his thoughts, comments and suggestions on a "School Board for the Future."
 - Ms. Margaret Martinez-Ingle stressed the importance of teachers; that the District cannot stand the loss of any more teachers. Priorities need to be established. Classrooms need teachers; students need teachers.
 - Mr. Gabriel Lopez, parent, spoke on behalf of Durfee Elementary special education teacher, Mr. Lopez who has been instrumental in assisting his son reach his goals.
 - Mr. David Retana, El Rancho High School teacher, shared that teachers have been asked for many years now to give up things, to sacrifice to save jobs. He feels that the District depends too heavily on furlough days and layoffs. He realizes that the budget issue is a difficult task, but asks the Board to reconsider.

- Ms. Shirley Prado, Birney Elementary teacher has been with the District for ten years, pink slipped for five. She spoke about how hard these budgets cuts are on staff morale; causes undue stress for many.
- Ms. Christina Mata, El Rancho High School teacher addressed the Board about furlough days. She feels that they are unacceptable and the District needs to find another answer.
- Mr. Cesar Roldan, El Rancho High alumni, shared information on a charity event that he will be participating in. Journey of Hope is a 63-day, 4,000 mile bicycle trip across the nation. He will be riding a bicycle 80 miles per day to raise awareness and funds to assist people with disabilities.

13. BOARD OF EDUCATION ANNOUNCEMENTS AND ACKNOWLEDGEMENTS

Board Members have the opportunity to report and discuss information regarding conference attendance, committee updates, and other District-related activities/observations.

- Mrs. Canchola expressed her appreciation to Mrs. Lopez for hosting the Board meeting. She asked for the site administrators and teachers to do their best to capture all the student attendance that we can to assist with our budget situation. She responded to Mr. Salcido's comment about Board members' stipends she made a personal choice and stopped receiving a stipend in January 2012. Mrs. Canchola commended all District personnel and volunteers for doing an outstanding job.
- Mrs. Ramirez reiterated Mr. Salcido's comment about School News she too, feels that we should do everything possible to get the publication in the hands of community members. She expressed her thanks to CSEA President, Dave Narvaez for the Blue Moon publication. Mrs. Ramirez indicated that during these hard financial times, difficult decisions need to be made. We need to look for different, creative ideas to ensure the children are getting a good education. She feels that there may be other ways and asked employees to come up with ideas for the Board to review.
- Mrs. Alvidrez shared that she is on the Board because she loves children, loves teaching. She responded to Mr. Salcido's comment regarding the stipend the Board receives. The entire \$400 stipend she receives monthly goes back to the children for science camp and other educational programs.
- Mr. Renteria thanked Mrs. Lopez for hosting the meeting. He recently attended the District Advisory Council meeting, Open House at several elementary schools as well as Community Pride Day hosted by the City. He was very impressed with the graduation ceremony of the One Million New Internet Users program. He has also been busy assisting the North Park band at several of their performances as well as assisting the El Rancho High track team.

13. BOARD OF EDUCATION ANNOUNCEMENTS AND ACKNOWLEDGEMENTS

• Dr. Rivera commented that in these most challenging economic times we need to work together. The challenges we face are not coming from the District itself, but from the State of California. He shared information on a newspaper article he recently read about the possible loss of significant funding to school districts from property taxes and what that will mean for the El Rancho USD. He offered his congratulations to the Pico Rivera Woman's Club on their 100th year anniversary. As a representative of the City of Pico Rivera, Dr. Rivera had the opportunity to participate in Rio Hondo Colleges' Oversight Committee meeting last month. The Hispanic Scholarship Foundation has raised approximately \$75,000 for El Rancho High graduates. Encouragement was offered to Cesar Roldan on his 63-day venture. Reminder to everyone that the District will be holding the Health Fair on May 12.

The Superintendent reports to the Board of Education on relevant educational issues, participation in, and attendance at seminars, conferences, and District activities.

• Dr. Coté recently completed her visitations to schools and was highly impressed with the teaching and learning happening in the classrooms. She commended staff for their diligent work. Dr. Coté thanked the Board for adopting the Resolutions on National Teacher Day and Classified School Employee Week and pointed out that this is how we feel as a District. She also informed the Board that today, Roxane Fuentes, Principal of Valencia Elementary, received her acceptance to USC to begin working on her doctorate.
