- .1 Approve educational field trip for 95 fifth grade students, 4 teachers, instructional aides and parent volunteers from Birney Elementary School to the House of Blues, in West Hollywood on February 17, 2004 and Transportation Agreement with Richmond Bus Company. Students will experience a live musical presentation that traces the history of "blues" from its roots in African musical traditions through its emergence and evolution as a unique American folk music and its influence on other forms of popular contemporary music. Expenditures of \$630 payable from Birney Elementary School Dads' Club funds.
- . 2 Approve educational whale watching field trip for 100 5<sup>th</sup> grade students, 4 teachers, and 10 parent volunteers from Magee Elementary School on February 6, 2004 from Pier Point Landing, Long Beach. Land transportation by PTC and water transportation aboard an U.S. Coast Guard approved vessel. Total expenditures of \$1,480 payable from Magee Elementary School PTA.
- .3 Approve educational whale watching field trip for 120 4<sup>th</sup> grade students, 4 teachers and parent volunteers from Birney Elementary School on March 12, 2004 from Pier Point Landing, Long Beach and Transportation Agreement with Richmond Bus Company. Land transportation by Richard Bus Company and water transportation aboard an U.S. Coast Guard approved vessel. Expenditures of \$1,510 payable from Birney Elementary School Dads' Club funds.
- .4 Approve participation of 4 teachers and 33 students from Burke Middle School in the AstroCamp Program at the Desert Sun Science Center in the San Jacinto Mountain from April 16-18, 2004. Expenditures of \$922.50 for subs and staff registration fee include training for follow-up science lessons payable from Burke Middle School Title I funds.
