- . 1 Approve attendance for one certificated staff member from the Categorical Programs Office to the 2003 National Title I Conference on February 1-4, 2003 in Anaheim. Expenditure of \$420 payable from Centralized Title I funds.
- . 2 Approve attendance for one certificated staff member and one classified staff member from Rivera Middle School to the "Parent-Teacher Relationship Seminar" on December 4, 2002 in Anaheim. Expenditures of \$280 payable from SIP funds.
- .3 Approve attendance for one certificated staff member (student council advisor) and four students members of the student council from Durfee Elementary School to the Student Council Conference on December 12, 2002 in Pasadena. Estimated expenditures of \$290 payable from SIP funds.

Bus transportation to and from San Pedro provided by PTC buses. Total expenditures not to exceed \$12,180. Expenditures payable from North Park Middle School ASB funds for buses, SIP funds for substitute teacher costs and student and chaperone costs payable from fundraisers and individuals at no cost to the District.
- .6 Approve consultant agreement Canter and Associates to provide one full-day workshop on January 13, 2003 and two follow-up workshops tentatively scheduled for February 26 and March 26, 2003.
